Feedback on Open-CMSIS Provisional Roadmap

- What is the difference between "Started" and "Development State" in the roadmap?
- Should "Cbuild" be listed as "A core Library component" in addition to the "PoC tools" category?
 Is the proposal to work out a reference tools or a PoC?
 - Can you confirm "close the gaps" is referring to the output of the "build exploration project"?
 - Can you refine ".cprj project examples"? Does it relate to "partial projects"?
- An important topic for ST is the evolution of the CMSIS-Spec on which we would propose a pullin on two aspects already introduced in the "Shadowfax" discussions
 - Evolution to find and produce Packs in line with ST proposals about classification and identification of components
 - The ability for vendors to add their differentiators to a common corpus of the spec, adding hooks or extensions that would be allowed by spec and accepted by tools like pack-checkers
- "Firmware update processes incl OTA programing" seems like a requirement that is not at the same level as other requirements how is it related to the other topics?

Multi-projects

- Can you explain *.ctarget choice naming? The description explains this is for holding project related information while name seems to be "target oriented"
- As mentioned in slides, Rzone seems to contain duplicate info, what is the rational for not adding the description information inside *.svd files?
- Where to put the boundary between the common part shared between open-CMSIS members and vendors tools instantiation?
 CMSIS-Zone addresses generic needs but it is not fitting for a usage "as such" in ST tools
- We wants to differentiate partitioning and configuration
